

Don't Look Up

The Radio Active Night in March was a practical demonstration of operating a handheld amateur radio (available to every level of radio ham licence) to communicate via Satellites.

What made it so helpful to was see Andy MOIXY pointing his "arrow" antenna at the sky having used a Phone App called "Heavens Above" to predict the time and direction the next satellites would appear above the horizon.

When the International Space Station flew overhead, they had made a special pass just for us (!) Andy made APRS contacts as far away as Spain, Belgium and Norway all via VHF 145.825MHz, APRS Freq for the ISS. In contrast, as you know from the Friday Night Net, VHF can only travel a short distance in comparison when going from point to point at ground level.



All this excitement was streamed live online and so extra visual clues were given like the fact that one of the Satellites didn't go right overhead. It became visible at one point on the horizon and disappeared at another point on the horizon but the entire trajectory was obscured behind the sports hall building.

Also, seeing the antenna being rotated to find a better reception of circular polarisation. The online chat facility had viewers asking questions as the evening progressed.
